

Ready, Steady, Go is an innovative programme for families with children aged between 0-5 years who may have either struggled through the pandemic or have additional needs.

Our aim is to offer structured play sessions with ponies and other animals to prepare children for their first years at school or pre-school.

The programme will take place over six weeks in an outdoor, countryside environment and sessions will be centred around nature, ponies and the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) framework, covering all seven topics:




- Personal, Social & Emotional Development
