The Academy is Circles Network's Alternative Education Provision, operating from our Rugby-based sites. We support children and young people who struggle to engage in traditional educational settings. Through our urban and rural academy spaces, students have access to outdoor learning, equine therapy, and courses in hairdressing, beauty, English, mathematics, and personal development aligned with their Education, Health, and Care Plans (EHCPs).

You will be part of a collaborative team, utilising your skills to enhance each student's learning experience while ensuring their safety and well-being. - Adhere to Circles Network's policies and procedures, including safeguarding and health & safety standards.
- Complete all mandatory training and participate in team and organisational meetings.
- Contribute to the growth of Circles Network through networking and information sharing.
- Provide transport for students when necessary.
- Support Circles Network activities and events as required.
- Undertake additional duties relevant to the role as directed by management.
